Do's & Don'ts for non-optician dispensary employees

There is always a bit of confusion over what tasks non-opticians working in an optical dispensary (not under the supervision of an optometrist), may perform. Hopefully this information will help clear up any grey areas.



optician may direct unregulated support staff/ stylists to assist in the dispensing facility by performing unrestricted activities under their direction. This may include activities such as:

Answering phones and booking

- appointments. Handing out product put aside for a
- client by a regulated health professional. · Assisting a client in choosing a frame.
- · Selling non-prescription sunglasses, ready-
- made readers or other products including contact lens solutions, lens cleaners, or accessories. Performing financial transactions or
- accounting. Maintaining and stocking product displays and shelves to company standards.
- Keeping the store clean, welcoming and ensuring health and safety standards are met.
- Unregulated staff may not: Suggest lens types






